UNHSC

The year was 1992 when the world grappled with the aftermath of the dissolution of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics (USSR). The threat of another great war, both national and international, loomed large. No conflict since the world wars had rivaled the intensity of the Cold War. The mighty Soviet regime, once thought invincible, collapsed. As Stalin once claimed, "The hammer and sickle shall stand the test of time," but history has proven that even the most powerful must fall. The world is littered with the ruins of empires that once believed themselves eternal.

In December 1991, the Soviet flag was lowered for the last time, marking the birth of numerous smaller nations long oppressed under the USSR. As 1992 began, a single superpower emerged unchallenged: the Eagle soared high, ravaging through the remains of its once friend turned foe.

In this climate, the United Nations Historical Security Council (UNHSC) convened on the agenda—"Situation" in the USSR." The session echoed the haunting line from a Russian war song: "For the Night Is Dark and Full of Terrors." Its theme—"Sahasen Bhavishyam Bhavaha," which translates to "Courage Shapes the Future."

ECOSOC

The ECOSOC committee convened to address the critical agenda of establishing a future currency framework aimed at ensuring global economic resilience. Discussions were marked by intense debate, particularly surrounding the dominance of the U.S. dollar. The delegate of the United States appeared divided—torn between maintaining dollar hegemony to preserve capitalist influence and promoting domestic economic equity.

The delegate of China came under repeated scrutiny for its currency policies and alleged “debt trap diplomacy,” prompting sharp exchanges on the geopolitical implications of de-dollarization. Despite the charged atmosphere, moderated caucuses provided space for productive dialogue on regional alternatives, crypto-based solutions, and multilateral financial cooperation.

Delegates from various countries presented constructive proposals, resulting in a wide spectrum of perspectives. Participation remained consistently high, with delegations exhibiting strong engagement, thorough research, and effective diplomacy. The committee’s tone was both intense and solution-oriented, underlining the urgency of reforming the global financial system.

As the committee advances toward drafting working papers, consensus-building and policy innovation remain central to its mission. ECOSOC is firmly committed to shaping a stable and resilient financial future.

stronger regulatory mechanisms, real-time financial disclosures, and greater surveillance by the Election Commission, ultimately reinforcing the need for cleaner and more accountable electoral processes.
